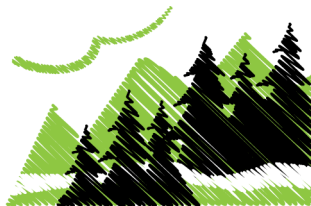

What is ECEAP?

ECEAP is a comprehensive, family-centered preschool program that provides free services and support to eligible children and their families. The goal of the program is to help ensure all Washington children enter kindergarten ready to succeed.

Snohomish ECEAP is a Monday—Thursday program and children attend either a morning or afternoon session. ECEAP is funded by the Washington State Department of Early Learning (DEL).



What services are provided?

Who is eligible?

Age	Children are accepted into ECEAP based on their age, family income or other reasons they would benefit from education, family support and health services. ECEAP prioritizes children who are 4 years old by August 31 and accepts children who are 3 years old by August 31 if space is available. Early registration is recommended.
Income	ECEAP accepts families at or below 110 percent of federal poverty level. ECEAP prioritizes children who are homeless, in foster care, receiving a Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) cash grant, and children who qualify for special education services through their school district. Families not meeting income guidelines may be considered if space is available.
